NOTES FROM TOWN HALL WITH ARCHBISHOP CORDILEONE AT ST. ANTHONY ON SEPTEMBER 30TH (Part 1 of 2)

Archbishop Cordileone offered a sincere apology for incidents of clerical sexual abuse. He expressed his anger, disgust and horror at the crimes that have been committed by clergy.

He said that in the 1990's there were six abuse allegations in San Francisco. Since 2000 there are no new accusations. (Note: Archbishop Cordileone became Archbishop of San Francisco in 2013.)

Regarding settlement monies, two \$30,000 payments were made for cases from Stockton in the 1950's; they were mostly funded by insurance and no monies were taken from parish funds.

The website <https://www.sfarchdiocese.org/protecting-children> spells out our policies regarding protection of children. All those working with children in our parishes and archdiocese must pass a FBI background check and an online course VIRTUS every 3 years.

In 2002, the US Bishops passed a "Charter on the Protection of Children," known as the Dallas Charter. As part of the Charter, the Archdiocese undergoes an annual review of practices and conducts an on-site audit every three years. These audits are performed by experts such as former FBI agents. The Archdiocese just completed their on-site audit in 2018 and we are in compliance.

When an accusation is made, the archdiocese will conduct a preliminary investigation. As a mandated reporter, the archdiocese will report the allegation to the civil authorities. The church may initiate a canonical trial process; during this time, the accused clergy will not perform any clerical duties.

The Archdiocese has an Internal Review Board (IRB) composed of an abuse victim, a retired judge, a retired police officer, a child psychologist, a pediatrician, a priest and a nun.

John McCord, an abuse victim, and a member of the IRB, spoke. The IRB meets 4 times a year and the Archbishop attends each one. The Archbishop has done everything asked of him by the IRB.

McCord asked if any survivors were present. Two men and one woman from the audience raised their hands. One man said that he attended St. Joseph Seminary from 1968-1970. He said many of the abusive priests were products of a secretive seminary culture back then. He expressed anger with Cardinal McCarrick.

The Dallas Charter applies to priests and deacons but not bishops. Accusations against bishops are under the purview of the Papal Nuncio, who is the Pope's representative to the U.S..

Before the 1970's abuse was seen as a moral problem resulting in "scolding" and priests were given a second chance. After 1980 the Bishop would review allegations, and if felt to be plausible, would meet with family for a private settlement. The accused would be rehabilitated, if possible. Then in 2002 came the Dallas Charter. The most recent reports are worse than most in the Church hierarchy ever knew.

The Archbishop said that the root of the problem lies in seminary formation. In 2005, the church conducted an Apostolic Visitation of all American Seminaries. Archbishop regards the seminary as his most important responsibility. Currently, candidates for the seminary undergo extensive psychological testing and interviews by both laity and priests before they are accepted as seminarians. Once accepted, they are under constant scrutiny by seminary faculty and the vocation director. Archbishop considers the current St Patrick's Seminary to be one of his brightest lights. They have a very strong faculty. Seminarians who are sexually active are dismissed.

In regards to a question about priest morale, Archbishop mentioned ongoing efforts to support priests include retreats, social events, celebration of ordination anniversaries; convocations; study days on different topics including sexuality.

Archbishop supports investigations on bishops but he is only one of 300 U.S. Bishops. Will seek support beyond his own for an Internal Review Board for Bishops.

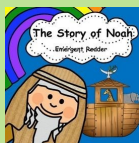
