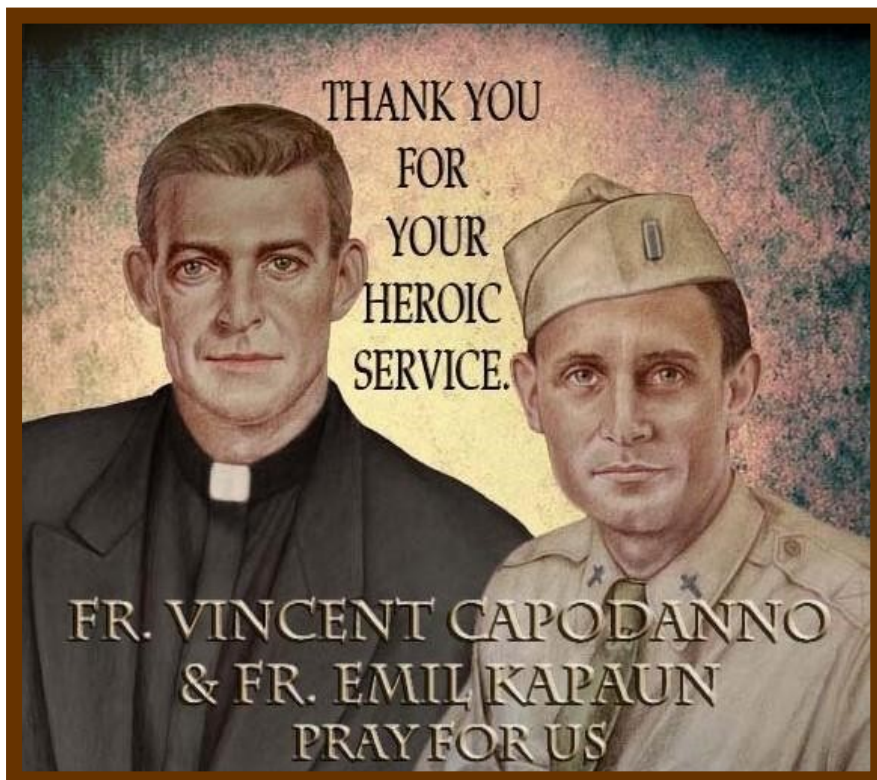

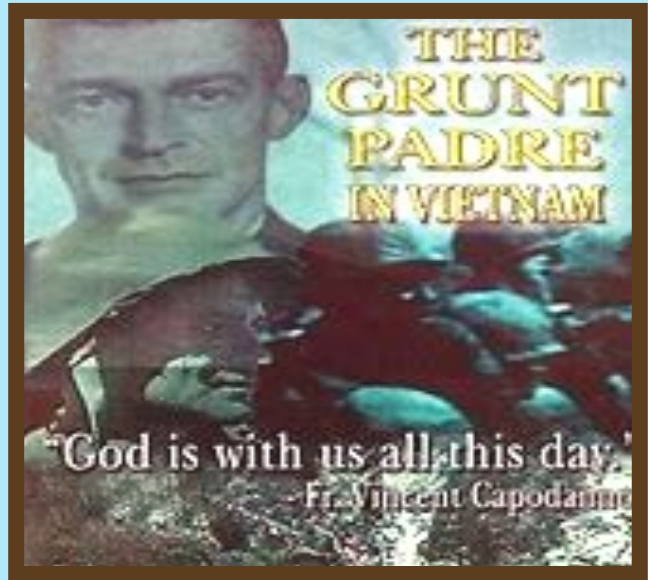

**Fr. Vincent Capodanno - "Grunt Padre"
Congressional Medal of Honor**

Born in Staten Island, New York in 1929, the youngest of ten children in an Italian immigrant family, Vincent felt called to become a missionary priest at the age of 20. Watching his older brothers join the U.S. Army and Marines, he asked his superiors to become a Navy chaplain. He was nicknamed "Grunt Padre" because of his personal care for and ministry to the "grunts" - the nickname for members of the infantry, like the Marines he served in his battalion after arriving in Vietnam.

On September 4, 1967, during his seventh combat operation, hearing reports the 2nd Platoon of M. Company was in danger of being overrun by a massed enemy assaulting force, Lt. Capodanno ran through an open area raked with fire, directly to the beleaguered platoon. Disregarding the intense enemy small-arms, automatic weapons and motor fire, he moved about the battlefield administering last rites to the dying. After an exploding mortar round inflicted painful multiple wounds to his arms and legs, and severed parts of his right hand, he refused medical aid. He directed the aid be given to his comrades. He continued to move about the battlefield as he provided encouragement by voice and example to the valiant Marines. While rushing to give aid to another mortally wounded Marine, he was struck down and killed by a burst of machine gun fire at the age of 38.

Memorial Day may now have a patron saint for those killed or wounded in action, for the families and for the military chaplains and those they serve. The canonization for Fr. Vincent Capodanno now goes to the Congregation for the Cause of Saints in Rome. God bless all who continue to serve our country, their families and our chaplains.

Position Description:

The DFF is responsible for the development, implementation, and administration of the overall faith development and evangelization efforts including Adult, RCIA, Youth, Children, Family and Sacramental Preparation.

The DFF reports to and works in close collaboration with the Parish Executive Director as well as the Pastor, Music Minister, other employees, clergy and key volunteers.
