**A Biblical Walk Through The Mass**

A Series

(provided by Edward Sri's book of the same name)

Our Catholic Mass has more going on than just sitting, standing, kneeling and making the sign of the cross. Do we truly understand the significance of the prayers we robotically say every Sunday? Are we able to give ourselves to God as fully as we could through these prayers? One key to unlocking the meaning of the rituals and prayers of the Mass is Scripture.

The soul attuned to God's Word in Scripture cannot help but notice that the Bible calls out to us in practically every prayer, sign and ritual of Mass. Candles and incense, standing and kneeling, phrases such as "The Lord be with you," and "Glory to God in the highest" - all these have their roots in Sacred Scripture. Knowing the biblical background of the prayers and rites of the Mass can shed much light on what is actually happening in the Liturgy.

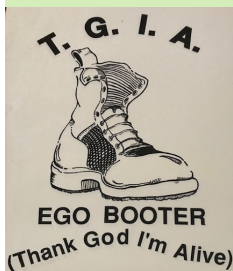
For example, "Glory to God in the highest," echoes the angels' song over Bethlehem on the first Christmas. Just as the angelic hosts welcomed Jesus with this hymn some 2,000 years ago, so also do we prepare to welcome Our Lord on our altars in the Eucharist when we sing or recite this prayer.

When the celebrant washes his hands before the Eucharistic Prayer, this recalls a similar rite performed by the Old Testament priests before approaching God's presence in the sanctuary. When we see our priest do this, we should be in awe, since this signals that he is approaching the holy presence of God and will offer the most sacred of all sacrifices as Christ makes his sacrifice on the cross present in the Eucharist through the priest.

**MEET YOUR FELLOW PARISHIONER AT ST. ANTHONY OF PADUA***This week we meet Jim Rasmussen and his wife Sylvia Landman*

Jim was twenty when he was drafted into the army. It was 1967 and Jim was going to Vietnam; specifically just south of Saigon. He finished his tour in 1968 and found himself back home. He had a Purple Heart and the Bronze Star to show for the year that he never wanted to talk about. He said, "I used to hear people say 'Thank God it's Friday,' and all I could think about was, 'Thank God I'm Alive,'" as he remembers the one afternoon his battalion suffered 60% casualties. He took etching to help reengage back into civilian life and ended up drawing his old army boot.



He went out with some buddies one night and got hit walking across the street by a drunk driver. Jim spent two years in the hospital, while the doctors put him back together, and another two years as an outpatient learning how to walk and talk again.

Jim settled in Marin and went to mass at St. Rafael's. He spent a lot of time talking with Fr. Frank Filice who suggested he go to Sunday Mass at the Carmelite Monastery. Jim took his advice because as Sylvia (his wife) put it, "Fr. Filice knew Jim was in trouble and he nurtured Jim back to life; back to the church." Jim went to mass so frequently at the Monastery that he became one of their Sacristans. He said, "I wanted to do anything I could. They were doing *me* a favor. The Sisters and the monastery were so peaceful and quiet that I felt God was showing me how it was in *His* world."

One Sunday he introduced himself to a visiting priest who was Vietnamese. When Mass ended, he watched everyone leave except a small group, all Vietnamese, kneeling and praying. Jim asked the new priest what they were praying about? "They pray for you and for me, Jim. I was also in Vietnam during the war and lost a leg." Thinking back on the moment, his eyes lost in reflection, Jim recalled no animosity; only reverence and humility.

Sylvia Landman came into Jim's life when he wheeled himself into a small business class she was teaching at Marin College. He eventually asked her out, but Sylvia had no idea that Jim's idea of a Friday night date was Mass at the Carmelite Monastery praying novenas. They married at the Monastery and, according to Sylvia, Jim was her 'Holy Moly' from that day forward.

Jim attends 9:00 am Mass at St. Anthony's every morning. It takes him a while to walk the block or so distance from his house to the church because walking doesn't come as easily as it once did. On Sundays, though, he doesn't notice because Sylvia is with him.
